

Our ASP Counselors make a difference everyday!

In December, three young sisters came to us with shaved heads because their own hair was so matted and dirty, after just having moved in with their grandparents.

At first they were very shy and would leave their groups at the ASP so they could be together. They didn't want to spend anytime apart. Since then, they have all really come out of their shells. They attend the program on a regular basis, vacations and all and we have introduced them to the Kinship Group. All 3 of them have made friends and no longer leave their groups. They are friendly, kind, and always say hi to the staff when they get off the bus.

The oldest one recently took the NYOI (National Youth Outcomes Initiative) survey the other day and Michelle one of ASP coordinators was in the room monitoring at the time. The young girl said that she answered positively to every question about her experiences in ASP (ex. Do you feel safe at the club? Do you feel like you can talk to all of the staff? Do you feel like your opinion matters?). Most importantly, she answered yes to the question, "Do you feel that your voice is heard at your after-school program?"
